

- Four-year Colleges and Universities
- Liberal Arts College
- Community College or Junior College
- Engineering or Tech College
- Technical School or Vocational School


4 Year University



A 4-year college program is an undergraduate degree program that leads to a bachelor's degree in a specific area of study. Students pursue a bachelor's degree to prepare for a profession, graduate study or both.

Liberal Arts College


A liberal arts college is a school that offers four-year degrees that are based on general liberal arts educations. These degrees are broad in breadth and are humanities based or science based, which means they are degrees that cover subjects like Art, Literature, English, Sociology, Political Science, Philosophy, History, Anthropology, Linguistics, Mathematics, etc.



Community College

Community colleges offer a distinct learning environment, and are recognized for smaller class sizes, more individualized attention and a supportive atmosphere. Community colleges also offer the following:

- A Pathway to a Four-Year Degree
- Affordability
- Relevance
- Partnership with Industry



Technical Schools



Technical postsecondary schools combine career-specific training with general academic curricula. While some programs take two to four years to complete, most can be completed in two years or less. Technical high schools combine this career training with secondary education.


What's Different?

- Higher student-to-instructor ratio
- Less contact with instructors
- Expectations to achieve independently
- High level of academic competence expected
- Fewer tests cover broader base of information
- No resource rooms

IEPs Do Not Go To College

- Students who have IEPs in high school should not expect the same level of services in college
- Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act and the Americans with Disabilities Act become applicable laws
- IEPs can sometimes be used for disability documentation and to help identify academic accommodations

Disability Student Services

- Most postsecondary schools have a point person for students with disabilities
- DSS staff can help identify and negotiate academic accommodations
- Quality and depth of services can vary greatly from school to school, so meet with DSS person before you commit

Documentation



- Each college establishes its own criteria
- May need HS records, letters from professionals, etc.
- Some colleges may require additional information
- Talk early in the process with the Disability Student Services provider to learn the requirements
- Keep a nice copy of your most recent IEP

Accommodations vs. Modifications

ACCOMMODATIONS

are used to help students access, understand or perform academic tasks.

MODIFICATIONS

Are changing academic task to make it easierr



Common Accommodations


- Extra time for tests
- Quiet space for test taking
- Use of assistive technology
- Tape-recording classes
- Oral tests instead of written
- Test reader
- Assistance with note taking
- Sign language interpreters

Ticket Out



- Cloze reading is an instructional strategy where users are required to fill in the blanks within a passage with correct words from a word bank.
- Many teachers create cloze reading passages to assess student vocabulary understanding within a particular story or passage or a group of spelling words.




